Maths

We will continue to use the White Rose Scheme of learning for maths. This term we are focusing on Place value, Addition and Subtraction and Shape.

We will be looking at some problem solving questions and continue our number bond/ times table challenges, which take place on Fridays.

English

Our class text this term is: Look up by Nathan Bryon

Children will be learning how to write a diary entry about a space flight, drawing on wider reading about the topic to inform vocabulary choices.



Creative Curriculum

Our topic is Movers and Shakers. This project teaches children about historically significant people who have had a major impact on the world. Children will learn to use timelines, stories and historical sources to find out about the people featured and use historical models to explore their significance.

We hope to arrange a day where we will come to school dressed as an inspirational person. We will celebrate them and their achievements.

Children must have their PE kits in school Monday—Friday. This includes: a house coloured top, a plain jumper, navy/black joggers/shorts and suitable trainers.
